### **FULLERS RD**

Reports to date on the operation of the new lane marking on Fullers Rd have been positive. RMS is currently undertaking speed analysis on the road. There has been an observable calming of the downhills traffic and people are feeling much safer in the right turn bays. NSW Police has installed camera warning signs. Expect random speed camera usage soon.

# **MOWBRAY SCHOOL**

Contrary to comments by the Popular Press, the proposed building program at Mowbray School will have a positive impact on sudent learning. A key outcome the school community was seeking was the retention of valuable open space on the site. This will be achieved with the plan developed by the Department of Education and the school community.

## **RECOGNISING PAT**

Council will be consulting with residents regarding a permanent tribute to Mayor Pat Reilly who died recently. Pat was on Council for 27 years and Mayor for 17 years. Reportedly he was one of the longest serving Mayors earning the title 'Mayor Emeritus'. # **DANGEROUS CHATSWOOD STATION**

Issues of concern are emerging re the North West Rail link. Of major concern is recent calculations that show that 50% of passengers who terminate at Chatswood will not fit on the next train to city. It could take three trains to clear the backlog. This means concerns for the safety of passengers on the station due to overcrowding.

#### MAYORAL ELECTION

The Mayoral By-Election will be held on the 12th April. Already a number of people have indicated that they intend to contest the election. So far there is one West Ward candidate- John Owen, the Council's former General Manager. John lives in Ivy Street, Chatswood. The Association will host a "Meet the Candidates' session on Thursday 20th March at 7:30 PM in the Dougherty Centre.

# NO RATE HIKE (YET)

Due to the work being undertaken by the General Manager and the Senior Management Team in undertaking a service review across the entire council to ascertain what organisational changes could be made to improve service delivery and where appropriate reduce costs to allocate back to asset improvements, council resolved not to make application for an increase to IPART for an increase in council's rate revenue commencing in 2014/15.
