# Local shops - more units?

The West Ward Councillors recently nominated the Fullers Road/Greville Street area and the Mowbray Road/Hinkler Crescent area for potential shopping centres. Past studies have shown that small shopping centres in the western portion of West Ward would not be viable without a significant increase in population surrounding the new centres. Previously, the opinion of local communities was not to proceed with such a move due to the likelihood of a swift uptake of higher density housing surrounding any new shops. # **Nelson loses 'arm'**

After community consultation, Council resolved to rename that portion of Nelson St between Orchard Rd and the Railway as Berkeley Court. The opportunity to rename the section of road arose with the removal of the Nelson Street traffic bridge which will not be replaced. CWWPA's position on this matter was that the local community should have the opportunity to suggest a name for the road. Council agreed. Berkeley was an English peer associated with naval activities. This is consistent with other streets in the vicinity with a naval theme. The vote to choose the new name was very close.

# **OH Reid Lights**

The local community has mobilised regarding the suggestion of putting floodlights (and possibly a synthetic surface) on the OH Reid Oval. Recently a resident's committee organised speakers to address Council on issues associated with the proposal. The speakers were supported by over fifty fellow residents in a 'sea of white" Tshirts display. Council is now claiming that there are no CURRENT plans to install floodlights. However it is drafting a Management Plan where the issue is likely to be canvassed. The Management Plan is expected to be released mid-year. It is hoped that our Ward Councillors will move a motion directing that consideration of floodlights not proceed on the oval.

Key issues raised at the Open Forum were the fragility of the surrounding bushland, the use of the bushland by native fauna including the Powerful Owl and a number of bat species and existing traffic problems.

In 1992, Willoughby Council proposed to install floodlights and a synthetic surface on behalf of a sporting group. After a concerted campaign by local residents the proposal was shelved.
