Increased Housing Density

After considering community feedback Council has resolved not to proceed with rezoning areas around our shopping facilities for increased housing density. There are plans to improve the areas around our shops with better paths and aesthetic features.

Council plans to focus increased urban densities within existing high rise areas, around the CBD and around local shops (excluding in the West Ward}.

Vegetation Policy

This includes regulations covering the removal and pruning of trees near homes. Submissions by 19th December 2019.

255 Bus Route

Council is implementing a range of parking control measures along this route in areas where the buses have been getting stuck.

Planning Reforms

The state government is proposing to reform the planning system to make it easier for developers to get approval for larger developments. This will likely mean that the community and neighbours will be by-passed.

The government is silent about reforms to improve the quality of buildings and about addressing the issues posed by private certifiers.
